

Strap-On Dildos, materials

- Jelly
 - Very inexpensive
 - Porous and difficult to keep clean
 - Can leach harmful phthalates gasses
 - Best used with condoms
- PVC
 - Also contain phthalates
 - Latex/Rubber toys
 - PHTHALATE FREE
 - Can be an allergen
- Elastomer
 - TPE (or TPR), Thermoplastic Elastomer
 - Porous
 - May or may not contain phthalates
 - Should not be stored with other plastics; they can melt
- Glass
 - Pyrex
 - Very hard, ridged
 - Non-porous
 - Boil or bleach to clean
 - Usually do not have flanges
 - EXPENSIVE
 - Acrylic
 - Should not be boiled, can develop cracks
 - Non-porous
 - Very hard
 - Less expensive than Pyrex
- Metal and Ceramic
 - Non-porous
 - Retains heat and cold
 - Easy to clean, boil

Glass, Metal, and Ceramic are usually too heavy for a strapon, are difficult to find, and like all hard materials, can bruise easily

- Silicone
 - Hypo-allergenic
 - Various densities: hefty, light
 - Flexible
 - Expensive
- Hard silicone
 - Pure silicone is non-porous, Easy to clean
 - Ridged, yet comfortable
- Soft silicone
 - Porous, boil for 5-10 min.
 - Very fleshy-feeling
